



MEMORANDUM ORDER

No. <u>76</u> Series of 2020

SUBJECT:

TEMPORARY BAN ON THE IMPORTATION OF DOMESTIC AND WILD BIRDS AND THEIR PRODUCTS INCLUDING POULTRY MEAT, DAY OLD CHICKS, EGGS AND SEMEN ORIGINATING FROM *England, United Kingdom*

WHEREAS, Section 6 and 7 (2) and (4) of Executive Order No. 292 provides the authority and responsibility for the exercise of the mandate of the Department and for the discharge of its powers and functions shall be vested in the Secretary, who shall have supervision and control of the Department, to establish the policies and standards for the operation of the Department pursuant to the approved programs of government and promulgate administrative issuances necessary for the efficient administration of the offices under the Secretary and the proper execution of the laws relative thereto;

WHEREAS, Section 1770 of Act No. 2711 (Revised Administrative Code of 1917) which was adopted by incorporation together with Sections 1761-1769, in Section 5 of Act 3639 (Charter of BAI) empowers the Department Head to issue a general order preventing the entry of animals, animal effects, parts or products from any country with dangerous communicable animal disease;

WHEREAS, based on the official report submitted by Dr Christine Middlemiss, Chief Veterinary Officer, Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, London, United Kingdom to the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) on November 12 2020, that there was an outbreak of H5N8 Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) virus in Hereford, England affecting broiler breeder rearing birds as confirmed by the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA), Weybridge;

WHEREAS, the outbreaks have continuously spread to other areas in United Kingdom such as Leicestershire and Hambleton, aside from the previously reported areas in Hereford and Frodsham;

WHEREAS, there is a need to prevent the entry of HPAI virus to protect the health of the local poultry population;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM D. DAR, Secretary of the Department of Agriculture, by the powers vested in me by law, do hereby institute the following emergency measures for the importation of domestic and wild birds and their products from England, United Kingdom:

- 1 Banning the importation of domestic and wild birds and their products, including poultry meat, day old chicks, eggs, and semen;
- 2 Immediate suspension of the processing, evaluation of the application and issuance of Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) import clearance to the above-stated commodities;

- All incoming poultry meat shipments with SPS import clearance issued **on or before December 4, 2020** will be allowed provided that frozen poultry meat has a slaughter/process date of 21 days prior to the start of the first HPAI outbreak in United Kingdom (on or before October 3, 2020). All shipments will be subject to veterinary quarantine rules and regulations.
- 4 Stoppage and confiscation of all shipments of the above stated commodities (with the exception on heat treated products) into the country by all Veterinary Quarantine Officers/Inspectors at all major ports of entry if the provisions written in Item 3 are not followed.
- 5 Importation of meat products of poultry is subject to the conditions provided in Article 10.4.19, 10.4.20 and 10.4.26 of OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code (2019)¹.

This **ORDER** shall take effect immediately and shall remain enforced unless revoked in writing. All orders inconsistent herewith are deemed revoked.

¹Heat treated products are acceptable following chapter 10.4 of the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code (2019) provided that in addition to the Veterinary Health Certificate, the Competent Authority will include in the certification the following:

• Temperature and the duration of heating or pasteurization of products; and
